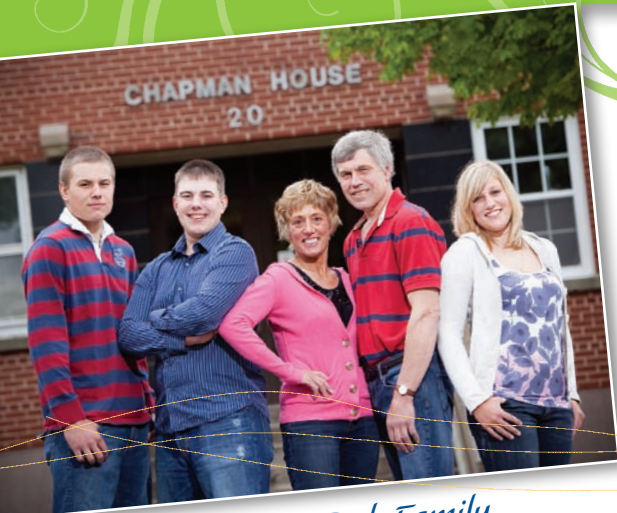


Supporting *Our Families*

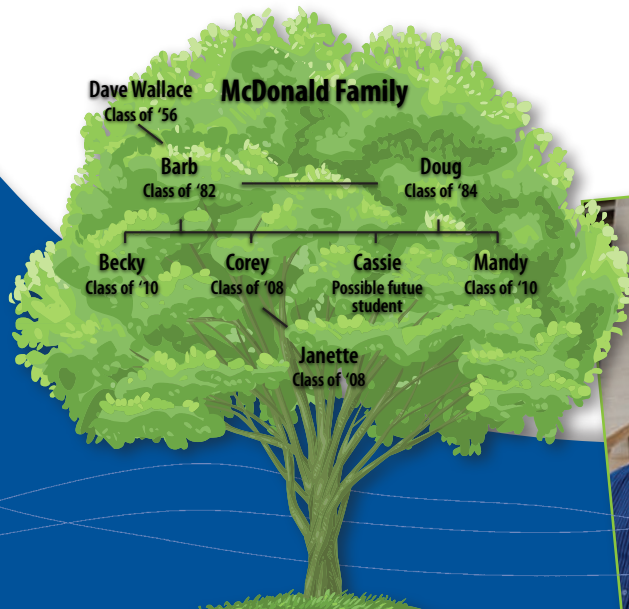
