Nova Scotia is the first province in Canada to adopt a Sustainable Procurement Policy. But what is sustainable procurement?

"It means taking responsibility for the long-term impacts of our purchasing and consumption decisions. We need to take a holistic approach by considering the environmental, economic, and societal impact of the purchases we make. Ultimately, we want our purchases of goods, services and construction to be better for our environment, our economy, and our communities." *Procurement Services*

As part of the roll out of this Sustainable Procurement Policy, training opportunities are being developed to educate users on the new policy and how it will support purchasing decisions.
